

IOWA STATE UNIVERSITY

Special Awards for Texas Residents

Iowa State University offers special scholarships to residents of this state who fulfill the specific academic criteria outlined for each award.

Students may not receive both the Academic Recognition Award and the Award for Competitive Excellence.

Deadline: These awards are provided to all qualified students who are offered admission by March 1, 2017. Awards may be made after this date, contingent upon the availability of funds.

Important: While these awards may be offered based on preliminary or self-reported academic information, all awards are contingent upon receipt of your official, final high school transcript verifying all requirements have been met. If your final transcript shows all requirements have not been fulfilled, your award will be withdrawn. A student must enroll at Iowa State University for the fall semester immediately following high school graduation to qualify for a freshman scholarship; a student who has attempted college coursework after the summer immediately following high school graduation is not eligible for freshman scholarships. Additionally, a student must be a U.S. citizen or U.S. permanent resident to qualify.

ACADEMIC RECOGNITION AWARD: \$22,000

\$5,500 per year for 4 years*

The Academic Recognition Award is automatically awarded to all out-of-state residents who have been offered admission to Iowa State as freshmen entering directly from high school and who rank in the top 25 percent of their graduating class. This is worth \$22,000 (\$5,500 per year for four years).

AWARD FOR COMPETITIVE EXCELLENCE (ACE)

The Award for Competitive Excellence (ACE) is automatically awarded to all out-of-state residents who have been offered admission to Iowa State as freshmen entering directly from high school and who have successfully completed one of the two sets of the college preparatory curricula outlined below, including cumulative grade point average and test score. Two levels of the ACE are awarded to students depending on their academic record.

ACE Level I: \$32,000

\$8,000 per year for 4 years*

Requirements:

Math	Through 1 year of calculus (pre-calculus does not satisfy this requirement)
Science	3 years from among biology, chemistry, and physics - Note: 9th grade physical science does not satisfy this requirement
Foreign Language	3 years of a single foreign language (through level 3 in high school, e.g., Spanish 3) or 2 years each of 2 separate foreign languages
High School GPA	3.30 (4-point scale) or higher
Test Score	ACT of at least 28 or SAT Critical Reading+Math of at least 1240 (if taken before March 2016) or SAT Reading and Writing+Math of at least 1310 (if taken March 2016 or later)

ACE Level II: \$26,000

\$6,500 per year for 4 years*

Requirements:

Math	4 years from among algebra, geometry, trigonometry, pre-calculus, or calculus
Science	3 years from among biology, chemistry, and physics - Note: 9th grade physical science does not satisfy this requirement
Foreign Language	2 years of a single foreign language (through level 2 in high school, e.g., Spanish 2)
High School GPA	3.00 (4-point scale) or higher
Test Score	ACT of at least 26 or SAT Critical Reading+Math of at least 1170 (if taken before March 2016) or SAT Reading and Writing+Math of at least 1240 (if taken March 2016 or later)

NONRESIDENT INITIATIVE TO COMMEND EXCELLENCE (NICE): \$12,000

\$3,000 per year for 4 years*

The Nonresident Initiative to Commend Excellence (NICE) is automatically awarded to residents of this state who have been offered admission to Iowa State as freshmen entering directly from high school and who have achieved at least a 3.00 high school cumulative grade point average (on a 4-point scale). This award is worth \$12,000 (\$3,000 per year for four years). The NICE can be combined with the Academic Recognition Award or the ACE.

RETURN TO IOWA—GENERATIONS SCHOLARSHIP: \$6,000

\$1,500 per year for 4 years for freshmen*

The Return to Iowa – Generations Scholarship is awarded to students who have been offered admission to Iowa State as freshmen entering directly from high school and who are nonresident children or grandchildren of Iowa State graduates. A graduate is defined as any person who has been awarded a bachelor's, master's, or doctoral degree from Iowa State.

The Generations Scholarship requires an application! In order to be considered for this scholarship, students must provide information so the graduation of the parent, step-parent, legal guardian, or grandparent may be verified. Students may complete the scholarship application form available online at www.admissions.iastate.edu/generations. The Generations scholarship is worth \$6,000 (\$1,500 per year for four years) and can be combined with the Academic Recognition Award or the Award for Competitive Excellence (ACE). Applications are due March 1, 2017.

This award is available during fall and spring semesters only, not during the summer session. Estimated tuition, fees, room, and board for 2016-2017 total \$29,839 for out-of-state residents. Out of state students who have a cumulative 3.0+ high school GPA are eligible to apply
Application Fee-\$40.00 non-refundable application fee

	Gateway Tuition (3.5+ High School GPA)
UAEC 200: Gateway Course (two college credit hours) Cost for student with 3.0-3.499 HS GPA is current tuition for UA Distance Learner (\$346.00 per credit hour)	\$692.00 (with 3.0-3.499 HS GPA)
Student with 3.5+ cumulative GPA receives partial tuition scholarship (approximately \$86.50 per credit hour)	-\$173.00
Net cost to enroll in Gateway Course (UAEC 200 for two credit hours)	\$519.00 (with 3.5+ HS GPA)

UA Early College Course Tuition - After students complete and pass UAEC 200, they are eligible to enroll in courses offered through UA Early College. Dependents of UA Alumni members are also eligible for a \$25.00 University Supply Store book scholarship (when enrolled in a class).

(i.e. Anthropology, Computer Science, English, History, Psychology, Art History, Japanese, Math)	
Cost for student with 3.0-3.499 HS GPA is current tuition for UA Distance Learner (\$346.00 per credit hour)	\$1,038.00 (with 3.0-3.499 HS GPA)
Student with 3.5+ cumulative HS GPA receives partial tuition UA Early College Scholarship (approximately \$86.50 per credit hour)	-\$259.50
Net cost for course(s): May incur additional costs for lab fees and/or textbook	\$778.50 (with 3.5+ HS GPA)

Out of state students who have a cumulative 3.0+ high school GPA are eligible to apply for UA Early College. Students who submit an official high school transcript with 3.5+ cumulative GPA since the 9th grade **will automatically receive the partial tuition scholarship** for courses approved by UA Early College.
